### Parent Pick-Up Procedures

- Please remember to send in your notes for daily Parent Pick-up to the office. If emailing notes, please send correspondence to <u>lpiccininni@millstone.k12.nj.us</u> and your child's homeroom teacher.
- Any change in your child's regular dismissal plans requires a note
- Parents, please be ready to show ID even if you regularly pick up your student!



### Gentle Reminders....

During the first weeks of school, the buses may take longer than usual for pick-up and drop-off at your appointed stop. Buses do not leave our bus loop until we ensure that students participating in community education programs or being picked up by parents have been accounted for. Once our routine is established, dismissal runs much smoother. To assist us in a smooth dismissal, we ask that should there be any change in your child's dismissal procedure a signed note is sent to our main office.

Student morning drop-off is located at the middle doors in the front of the school building. For morning drop-off, a staff member will open the doors at 8:55 am. For the health and safety of students, no student should be dropped off prior to 8:55am. We ask that in the morning, parents pull along the sidewalk outside the school near the middle doors, so that students can exit vehicles on the passenger side only. Should you need to park in the lot, you must escort your child to the doors to ensure they are not crossing in front of vehicles. If you arrive at school and the middle doors are closed, you must park and walk your student into the main office to be signed in and receive a pass to class.

In the afternoons, parents picking up their students will gather outside the main entrance. For the safety of students, parents are not allowed in the building during dismissal. Staff members will begin checking IDs at approximately 3:30. Please be sure to have your photo id ready whenever picking you child up from school. We will ask families, even those picking up routinely, to show identification at parent pick-up. Once we have verified our afternoon pick-up lists,, students will be dismissed from the building. Since our parent pick-up location is outdoors (even during inclement or cold weather), we encourage you to utilize district provided transportation whenever possible. If your child is going to be a regular parent pick-up dismissal, please send a signed note to the main office.

Parents who wish to have a child dismissed before the regular school dismissal must report to the main office and sign their child out prior to 3:15. After 3:15, all students will be dismissed from parent pick-up to ensure student safety. It is requested that early dismissals from school be held to a minimum as core classes are taught during 9th period. Children may only be picked up by parents/guardians or by another adult after the office receives a written note approving a pick-up from the parent/guardian. Please remember that any authorized adult picking up your student must have a valid picture ID.
